
## Democracy Report 2022

#### Context

Recently, the V-Dem Institute at Sweden's University of Gothenburg has come out with their annual democracy report.

#### \* Key Highlights

- **Title-** Democracy Report 2022: Autocratisation Changing Nature?
- The report classifies countries into **four regime** types based on their score. in the Liberal Democratic Index (LDI):
  - Liberal Democracy.
  - Electoral Democracy.
  - Electoral Autocracy.
  - Closed Autocracy.
- Methodology
  - V-Dem uses aggregate expert judgments to produce estimates of critical concepts.
  - It gathers data from a pool of over 3,700 country experts who provide judgments on different concepts and cases.



- The V-Dem's measurement model algorithmically estimates both the degree:
  - To which an **expert is** reliable relative to other experts.
  - To which their perception differs from other experts to come up with the most accurate values for every parameter.

#### Key Finding of the Report About India \*

- India is part of a broader global trend of an anti-plural political party driving a country's autocratisation.
- Ranked 93rd in the LDI, India figures in the "bottom 50%" of countries.
- It has slipped further down in the Electoral Democracy Index, to 100, and even lower in the Deliberative Component Index, at 102.
- In South Asia, India is ranked below Sri Lanka (88), Nepal (71), and Bhutan (65) and above Pakistan (117) in the LDI.

#### \* Key Findings of the Report

- Sweden topped the LDI index.
- Other Scandinavian countries such as **Denmark** and **Norway**, along with **Costa Rica** and **New Zealand** make up the top five in **liberal democracy rankings**.
- Autocratisation is spreading rapidly, with a record of 33 countries autocratising.
- Signaling a sharp break from an **average of 1.2 coups per year**, 2021 saw a record 6 coups, resulting in 4 new autocracies: Chad, Guinea, Mali and Myanmar.
- While the number of **liberal democracies stood at 42 in 2012**, their number has shrunk to their lowest level (34 Countries) in over 25 years,
- 13% of the world population living in liberal democracies.
- Closed autocracies, or dictatorships, rose from 25 to 30 between 2020 and 2021.
- While the world today has **89 democracies and 90 autocracies, electoral autocracy remains the most common** regime type, accounting for 60 countries and 44% of the world population or 3.4 billion people.
- Electoral democracies were the second most common regime, accounting for 55 countries and 16% of the world population.

## **Three New Species Recorded from Visakhapatnam**

#### ✤ <u>Context</u>

For the first time, three new species of migratory birds have been recorded from Visakhapatnam at the recentlyconcluded Asian Waterbird Census.

#### Key Highlights

- They spotted two **Great Knots**, Six **Sanderlings** and **Billed Sandpipers** while exploring the area.
- During earlier years, all the data was compiled State-wise and India data was consolidated by BNHS (Bombay Natural History Society) which in turn is consolidated internationally.
- Now, the online portal eBird has brought birders of the world on to a common platform to consolidate the data collected at one place.

- By 2000, the estimated breeding population of the species was **350–500**.
- It migrates down the Pacific coast through Japan, Korea and China, to its main wintering grounds in south and southeast Asia, where it has been recorded from India, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka etc.

#### \* Context

### **Boltzmann Medal**



Recently, Deepak Dhar, physicist, from the Indian Institute of Science Education and Research, Pune, has been selected for the Boltzmann medal.

#### \* Key Highlights

- It is awarded by the Commission on Statistical Physics (C3) of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics.
- This award was **initiated in 1975**, with Nobel laureate (1982) K.G. Wilson being the first recipient.
- Deepak Dhar became the first Indian to win this award.
- The medal, which honours outstanding achievements in the field of statistical physics, has been given to one or two persons, once in three years, in the last 47 years.
- It is given only once to a person and on the condition that person has not won the Nobel prize so far.
- Dhar shares the platform with American scientist John J. Hopfield who is known for his invention of an associative neural network, now named after him. The award consists of the gilded Boltzmann medal with the inscription of Ludwig Boltzmann, and the chosen two scientists will be presented the medals at the StatPhys28 conference to be held in Tokyo, 7-11 August, 2023.

#### ✤ Context

- Recently, a first-of-its-kind indigenous aircraft trainer, HANSA-NG, has completed sea-level trials in Puducherry.
- This trial was a necessary condition before evaluation by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA).

#### \* Key Highlights

- Developed by CSIR-National Aerospace Laboratories (CSIR-NAL).
- HANSA-New Generation is reportedly one of the most advanced flying trainers.
- Features:
  - Powered by a Rotax digital control engine.
  - Composite lightweight airframe.
  - A glass cockpit.
  - A bubble canopy with a wide panoramic view.
  - Electrically operated flaps.
- Significance:
  - This Aircraft is designed to meet the need of flying clubs in India for trainer aircraft. It is an ideal aircraft for commercial pilot licensing due to its low cost and low fuel consumption.
  - It is also a revamped version of the original Hansa developed three decades ago

- The Indian Air Force (IAF) conducts Exercise Vayu Shakti at the Pokharan range every three years to demonstrate its readiness to conduct full-spectrum operations.
- The exercise had started in 1953.

The Limited Liability Partnership (Second Amendment) Rules 2022	partne bankru ♦ <u>Key Highl</u>	<b>Ainistry of Corporate Affairs</b> has amended the limited liability rship (LLP) rules to address the concerns of entities facing uptcy proceedings.		

The rules, effective 4 March, modified reporting requirements of LLPs in financial distress.
It primarily deals with solvency statements and certificates of truthfulness, which are part of the annual returns.
Hence, an LLP's statement of solvency, which is required to be signed by a designated partner in charge of compliance, can be signed off by a resolution professional in case of a bankrupt entity.
The rules outline the administrative changes LLPs undergo once bankruptcy proceedings are underway and the turnaround professional hired by lenders to take charge of the affairs of an LLP.
Partners or shareholders will remain in control of a business so long as debt is serviced, but after a default, lenders get the upper hand in taking decisions under the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, including the right to take over the management and restructure the business.
