Institutions in India) Regulations 2023

Context

Recently, higher education regulator University Grants Commission (UGC) released draft regulations to allow foreign universities to enter India.

 Key Highlights: The National Education Policy, 2020, envisages a legislative framework to allow top global universities to operate in India. According to draft norms Foreign universities can set up their campuses in India, decide their admission process, fee structure, and will also be able to repatriate funds to their parent campuses. It seeks to offer considerable freedom to foreign education players willing to explore the Indian market. It underlines that they shall not offer any such "programme of study that jeopardises the national interest of India or the standards of higher education in India. The draft says the operation of Foreign Higher Educational Institutions shall not be contrary to - The security of the State. Fiendly relations with foreign States. Public order, decency, or morality. 	 Eligibility Universities that participate in global rankings will require a place in the top 500 — either in the overall or subject-wise category — to apply to set up campuses in India. Those that do not participate in such rankings will need to be "reputed" in their respective countries. The draft regulations do not specify a metric to judge the 'reputation' of the university. Approval Initially, universities will be granted approval to operate for 10 years. At the end of the ninth year, they will have to file for renewal of approval. About FRP

- FRP is the price declared by the government, which mills are legally bound to pay to farmers for the cane procured from them.
- It was introduced in 2009 and replaced the concept of Statutory Minimum Price (SMP).
- **Determination of FRP**
 - Since sugar pricing comes under the **concurrent list**, the Supreme Court has held that both the center and the state have the power to fix sugarcane prices while the center's price is the minimum price, states can set an **SAP** that will always be higher than the center's FRP.

		 The Central Government announces Fair and Remunerative Prices in consultation with state governments and sugar industries. These prices are determined on the recommendation of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP) and are announced by the Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, which is chaired by the Prime Minister. SAP- State Advised Price or SAP is the price announced by the state government, over and above the FRP.
<section-header></section-header>		 Context ➢ Recently, The Assam Cabinet approved the construction of elephant underpasses in seven jumbo corridors along the boundary of Deepor Beel. Key Highlights: Deepor Beel is a perennial freshwater lake located 10 km south-west of Guwahati city. It is the only wetland in Assam designated as a site of importance for "conservation and sustainable use" under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands. It is known for its fish and bird diversity and rich aquatic vegetation that attracts wild elephants, faces conservation threats from garbage dumping, quarrying, and the construction of a railway line. It sustains over 200 species of birds, including about 70 species of migratory birds. Some globally threatened birds are supported, including Spot-billed Pelican, Lesser Greater Adjutant Stork and Baer's Pochard. The Rani and Garbhanga hills, the habitat of the Asiatic elephants in the southern side of the beel, are part of this ecosystem. In 2021, the Environment Ministry notified it as an Eco-sensitive zone.

Hawaii's Kilauea Volcano Erupts Again	*	Hawaii's Kilauea began erupting inside its summit crater, the U.S. Geological Survey said, less than one month after the volcano and its larger neighbor Mauna Loa stopped releasing lava. Key Highlights:
		 Kilauea's summit is inside Hawaii Volcanoes National Park and away from residential communities. Kilauea is one of the world's most active volcanoes. Hawaii had two volcanoes spewing lava side by side when Mauna Loa erupted for the first time in 38 years. Both volcanoes stopped erupting at about the same time. Scientists planned to look at data to study the relationship between the two volcanoes. For Native Hawaiians, volcanic eruptions have deep cultural and spiritual significance. During Mauna Loa's eruption, many Hawaiians took part in cultural traditions, such as singing, chanting and dancing to honor Pele, the deity of volcanoes and fire, and leaving offerings known as "hookupu."
